#### The Power of Praise

Studies have shown that positive reinforcement has much more of an effect than any other disciplinary method. It allows students to realize they have done something right and praiseworthy, which in turn causes repetition in good behavior.

Positive reinforcement is most effective when it is given immediately after the behavior. The shorter the amount of time, the stronger the relevancy and connection will be to the behavior and positive reinforcement. Most importantly, the reinforcement should be presented enthusiastically and with a smile.

Students often feel defeated in school, especially when they do not receive very much praise by teachers. They are constantly hearing what they are doing wrong instead of right, which causes them to have feelings of self-doubt and hopelessness. In a world where praise and commendations are offered few and far between, we need to remember that positive reinforcement is what allows students to repeat good behavior.
